At last Thursday's Liturgy Committee meeting we did a brief evaluation of our parish liturgical life. The Children's Christmas Eve Mass was much appreciated and some folks sent an email expressing their gratitude for this celebration plus our 'Midnight' Mass. Thanks again to all who put it together and who prepared our 2 churches for the Christmas season along with all the "back up" support needed in every parish. Lise and Anne did a short report on the Advent Penitential Service. We had about 22 parishioners present for this and we had visiting priests to help with the celebration. The idea of visiting priests was seen as very helpful. One young person joined us for the service and, whilst time is always precious for everybody, it was appreciated that the service was not unduly long, an Advent retreat-like atmosphere was maintained throughout and people were free to leave when they chose to do so although it is preferred to stay on until the end!

Our Parish and the holy season of Lent: every Lent is an invitation to become more attached to the ways and the teaching of Christ. This Lent will be no different! Pope Francis will write a message to the Faithful and invite them again to embark on this journey with faith, hope and love. The activities in parish life are only little "props" for us to use and people may choose to ignore these and have their own "props". This is fine except, of course, a community activity does give us something to build around and to have as a focal point especially if we make such activities an important part of our planning. This year, we will have Mass at 11.30am on Fridays followed by a short form of the Way of the Cross: soup will be available in the parish rooms afterwards and donations can be given for our Lent charity. Obviously, people who would like to make the Way of the Cross at other times are free to make their own arrangements in either of our churches.

This year we had several requests for financial help through our Lent Jars. Requests from Uganda, Vietnam, Nigeria and Sierra Leone have been mentioned. What we agreed in the Liturgy meeting was to offer the proceeds from our Lent Jars to Sierra Leone's *Street Children* and a member of the Liturgy Committee will obtain further information for us.

From the Parish Social Committee We try **not** to overburden our parishioners with too many demands because the success of our social events depends on the generous support of a core group in the parish community. We're always truly grateful to all who give this support. This year we are "pruning" the tree a little bit more and hope to put all our efforts into 2 summer events viz. the BBQ on 6th June and the Summer Fair on 27th June. If you could make a note of those dates **even now** – how wonderful that would be! On 22nd March we'll be offering something different after the Sunday morning Mass - a little 'bacon butties service'. The 'butties' will not be free, costing £2.00 and proceeds will go to the parish as part of our fund raising.
